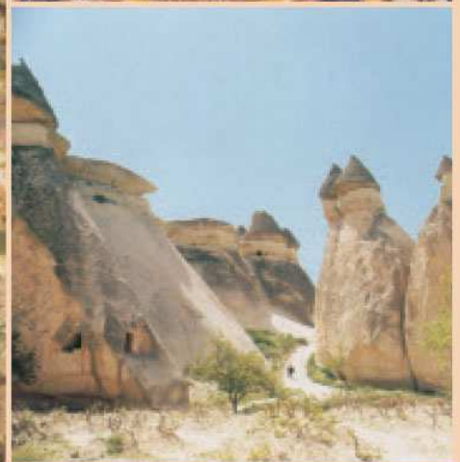
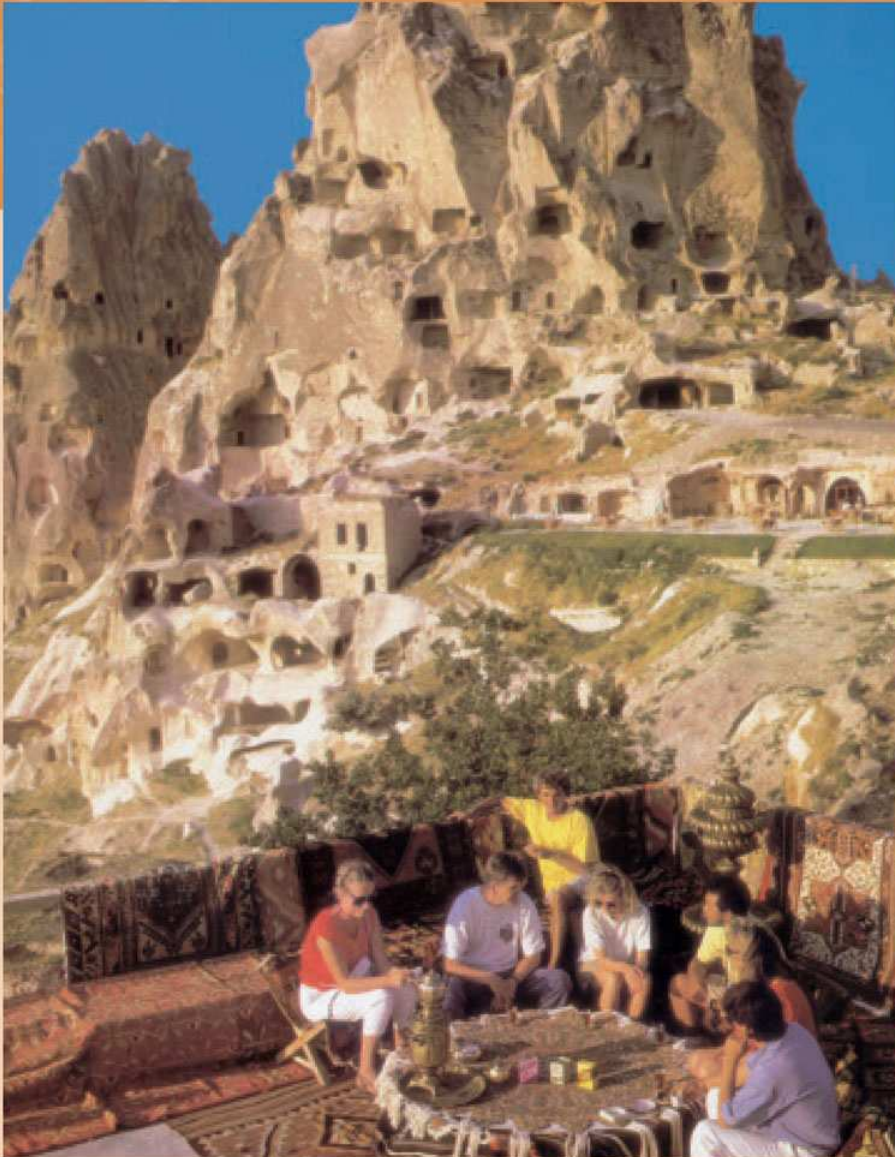


Special interest: Cappadocia

Cappadocia is one of the world's most ancient inhabited regions and is also one of the most enchanting. Subterranean cities, cave houses, tunnels and fairy chimneys are all around the beautiful landscape which is an archaeologist's paradise.



The Hittites dominated Cappadocia for many years who were then followed by the Christians who fled from Roman rule in the first century. It was these Christians who built into the rock making a labyrinth of tunnels and churches where they hid from their persecutors. These churches can be visited even today and with over 400 in the Goreme Valley alone, you will be amazed at the skill and effort that was put in to provide an area of solitude for then early Christians.

There are 36 subterranean cities in the area which can be visited today and are still marvelled at for their ability to provide water

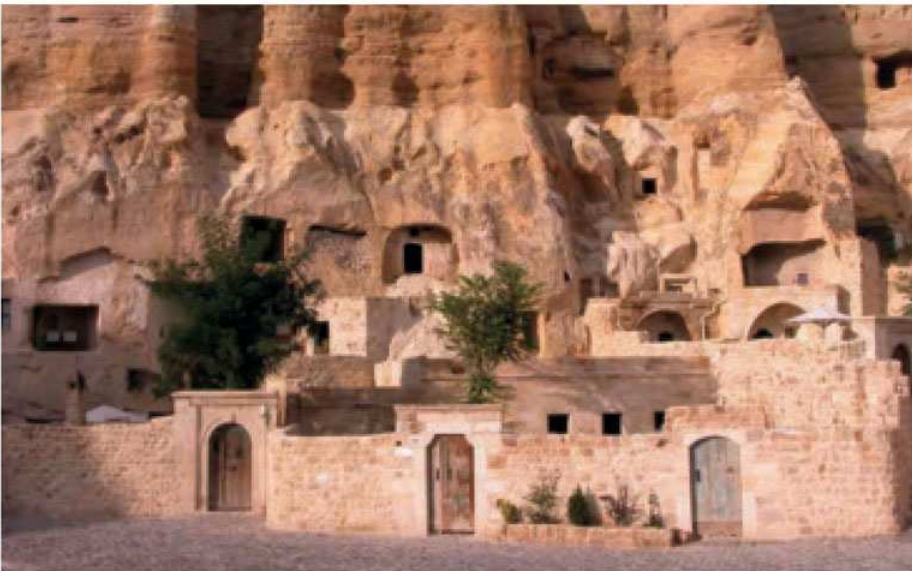
and food for those in them. Kaymakli is perhaps most famous with its labyrinth of interconnecting tunnels and caves extending 9 storeys and 170ft below the Earth's surface. The landscape of Cappadocia was in fact formed between 30–60 millions years ago when the region was a stage for fierce volcanic activity which continued for thousands of years. As a result, the region evolved and the accumulation of volcanic ash slowly turned it into 'tufa', the surface of which hardened upon contact with the air.

Over centuries, the plateau was eroded by rivers, earthquakes and storms which, as a result caused the breathtaking rock formation we see

in Cappadocia today. Cappadocia's extraordinary stalagmite pillars are known as "fairy chimneys". The stunning scenery, history and hospitality of the people in the region, make Cappadocia one of the most charming places on our planet. Everywhere you will be mesmerised by the timeless quality of rural Turkish life.
